

Board Initiatives

In 2016, the Four County ADAMhs Board led the initiative on two very important services to the community; the Local Outreach to Survivors of Suicide Team (LOSS), and the Crisis Intervention Team (CIT).

In times of traumatic crisis, getting the right kind of support is critical. The LOSS Team is a group of first responders who go to the scene of a suicide to provide support and referral to the newly bereaved. Statistics show that without intervention, those who lose a loved one to suicide are nine times more likely to take their own life. The primary goal of LOSS is to shorten the elapsed time between the death and a survivor finding the help needed to cope with this devastating loss. By connecting those bereaved by suicide to community supports, the LOSS Team is able to reduce the negative impact of traumatic grief and save lives. In 2016, the LOSS Team provided support to 21 area families.

The Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) is a community partnership of law enforcement and mental health professionals. It is an innovative first-responder model designed to help persons with mental health concerns access treatment, rather than placing them in the criminal justice system due to illness related behaviors. The CIT training teaches local law enforcement and corrections officers how to respond to individuals who are experiencing a psychiatric crisis. It also promotes officer safety and the safety of the individual in crisis. The first local CIT training took place in 2010. Since this time, more than 86 local law enforcement and corrections officers have been trained in the model.

Both the LOSS Team and CIT have had a positive impact on the residents of our four-county communities.
