

Board Initiatives

For several years, the Four County ADAMhs Board contracted with a local provider to operate *Fresh Start*, a men's drug and alcohol residential treatment center located in Alvordton, Ohio. The building which housed the treatment center was older, and often required costly repairs. Ultimately, the frequency of building maintenance became unmanageable, and presented an obstacle to service delivery. As a result, the ADAMhs Board began to seek a solution.

Early in 2017, a partnership was developed between A Renewed Mind, The Ohio Department of Mental Health, The Four County ADAMhs Board, and the Maumee Valley Planning Organization, to address the issue of the *Fresh Start* building. This partnership proved to be very successful, resulting in the December, 2017 opening of the *Renewal Center*; a 20 bed men's residential treatment facility, located in Napoleon, Ohio.

The results of Board's decision to invest in the development of the *Renewal Center* have been very positive. The new central location has increased access to drug and alcohol treatment services for area residents, and has improved the system's ability to recruit, employ, and maintain skilled professionals within our community. Most importantly, having a high quality residential facility in the four county area has resulted in more effective care and better treatment outcomes for our residents.
