

# Board Initiatives

Throughout Fiscal Year 2021, the effects of the on-going COVID-19 health crisis continued to be felt, making the availability of quality mental health care more important than ever. While many in our communities experienced increased stress during this time, area youth were uniquely affected. Disruptions in educational experiences, social relationships, family gatherings and activities resulted in increased symptoms of anxiety and depression, and put the most vulnerable at risk for a mental health crisis.

In response to the needs of our area youth, the Four County ADAMhs Board applied for and received \$322,000 in school-based prevention funding through the RecoveryOhio initiative, the Ohio Department of Mental Health and the Ohio Department of Education. These funds allowed the ADAMhs Board to partner with all 23 school districts throughout Defiance, Fulton, Henry and Williams counties, enabling them to provide evidenced based programming to "every student, every grade and every school". Programs such as Bounce Back and Mental Health First Aid, among others, worked to promote community partnerships, build resiliency and reduce risk factors associated with substance use and other mental health issues.

The Four County ADAMhs Board understands that good mental health is foundational to healthy families, healthy schools and healthy communities. As CEO, I'm proud of our investment in the wellbeing of our youth and in our belief that doing so insures a better future for us all. I look forward to leading the Four County ADAMhs Board into 2022 and appreciate your on-going support.
